

## GHP 2012 | THEATRE DESIGN | ASSIGNED SCRIPT REVIEW

The purpose of the Assigned Script Review is to show how well you research the ways other designers have approached a specific script, and how well you understand what they accomplished.

You do not create any designs of your own for the Assigned Script Review.

Using the internet, libraries, and other resources, find articles, reviews, interviews, photos, drawings, etc. of three to five productions of *The Taming of the Shrew*, by William Shakespeare. Try to find at least two visuals of each production. You may include no more than one movie version of the play. You may include any historical production for which there is adequate contemporary evidence of the design of the production, i.e., photographs, etc.

You may work with your media specialist and teacher to locate these materials. Keywords for online searches might include *review* or *production*.

Print out what you find and label it with:

- The producing theatre and the year of the production
- The director
- The designer(s)
- The source of the item (newspaper, website, etc.)

Be prepared in your interview to discuss what you've found: how you think the designers approached the script; how well their approach worked; what you admired about the production; what you found puzzling or misguided; any insights you gained about either the script itself or theatre design.

There is no need to put your materials in a presentation folder. A file folder and paperclips will be sufficient.
